



**“IT IS APPOINTED UNTO MAN ONCE TO DIE,
AFTER THAT FACE THE COURT ROOM.” (guilty or not guilty)**

MURDER as always been God’s highest red flag for the urgency of PRAYER. Apalachee High School in Winder, Georgia leads up to the **45th school shooting this year in the US.** 14-year-old Colt Gray sent a chilling apology to his mother in moments before the attack, **“I’m sorry, Mom.”** The community grapples with the devastating deaths of two students, two teachers, injuring nine others.

Marcee Gray, his Mom, while she was visiting her father in Fitzgerald, Georgia, received that text from her son. Alarmed she immediately called the school to warn them of an "extreme emergency." Marcee contacted a school counselor at Apalachee High School, urging them to find her son and check on him urgently. Despite her frantic efforts, the tragic shooting was unable to prevent the violence that ensued.

Colt Gray's father, Colin Gray, has also been charged in connection with the shooting. He faces charges of involuntary manslaughter and second-degree murder for providing his son with the AR-15-style rifle Christmas gift in the massacre. The weapon was reportedly given to Colt despite the boy's history of making online threats, which had previously led to an investigation by law enforcement.

As the community searches for answers, the tragedy has raised questions about the warning signs that were missed and the responsibility of the parents. Colt's grandfather, Charles Polhamus, has publicly condemned his son-in-law, blaming him for the family's downfall and the horrific actions of his grandson. Polhamus said, **“Colin Gray did this to his family, and he will rot in hell for it.”** He added that he believes Colt was driven to violence by his father's influence.

As Barrow County comes to terms with the tragedy, a recovery center has been established to offer support to the survivors and their families. **Since darkness is always present in the absence of light, if the light of daily prayer were present in the school, God would have intervened providing His protection.**

Lutheran Pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer, could not have declared this better who bravely challenged Adolf Hitler: “Silence in the face of evil is itself evil. God will not hold us guiltless. **Not to speak is to speak. Not to act is to act.**” If an 18-year-old secretary is being held accountable 80 years later for her failure to speak out against the atrocities of the Nazis, where will that leave us when we stand before a holy God who sees our omission and commission sins? **“He who knows to do good and doesn’t do it is sin.”** James 4:17

“America’s Public School History Against Truth” reveals just how far America has drifted from prayer and the Bible. **Please pray the Apalachee High School** that weekly prayer will pierce the darkness in their county.

FROM RAGS TO RESTORATION IN CHRIST ALONE



My name is Josh Mossman. I came from a broken home. I grew up as a broken child with no guidance, no education, with people who only cared about drugs at a time of growing up. I quit school because of two boys came after me and put a gun to my mouth the first two weeks of high school. Thank God the gun was empty!

Along the way I have seen and filled with every act of violence tormented physically, emotionally and spiritually. I have witnessed chaos always coming after me. Very little memory of really anything good **except for my praying grandparents.**

I worked from the time I was 14 in construction until I quit school at the age of 16 to for pay rent. If I didn't pay, I had to leave, but I didn't have a place to stay. I have been kicked out several times for several different places growing up. I've been homeless. I have witnessed a lot of what most people would not want to be part of. I have witnessed hell in my life. But to live, our God made a way.

Mr. David and I met at the Gwinnett courthouse for the first time in 2019. I was going through surgeries and cancer and was at the courthouse because my name was called to serve jury duty according to my memory. Unfortunately, I could not do jury duty or be there to support whichever case I was needed for. That broke me down after the surgeries and dealing with cancer and not being able to support the people that needed me the most in that courthouse. I was lost in a place at the right time with those people. The trauma of my brother's death, my cancer, my surgeries, and me not being able to serve my courthouse in Gwinnett County - I was at my weakest moment!

As I sat to cry in the middle of the courthouse, Mr. David came to me. He stretched out his right hand, hugged me in front of everybody in the courthouse, and prayed with me in the middle of that courthouse. It was like God saying, you're not my child. It was like God reaching into hell to call me out of hell. All this happening at the same time. Freaking out I was pulled out of hell when I needed Him the most to save ME!

God began to open my eyes to the way of the world. As I stand on the summit looking down, I am saddened by the violent acts of our communities in our state. It is time to put the 10 Commandments of God Almighty back into our kids again in our schools. It is time to build our nation with a history from the Bible and Constitution of America. The 10 commandments are the foundation of our Constitution. We have both of them because of God. When He administers the land, He gave dominion to godly men.



The reason I want to personally learn the courthouse ministry is because I would like to be an encouragement to as many people as possible. I am a student in what God has planned for me. *Matthew 17:20-21.* Jesus said, *"Because of your little faith. For truly I say unto you if you have faith of a grain of a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, move from here to there, and it will be moved. Nothing will be impossible with you."*

I am not normal or properly functioning, but when people look at me or talk, that's what stands out about me and always has. Now God has made room for me to help in different ways. I am learning as a student of God Almighty and His teachings. (Josh Mossman)
